

Live Educational Experts are waiting in a virtual classroom to support your educational needs and assignment questions!

Be sure to have your assignments ready to go from either your classroom teacher or work assigned from your Google Classroom. This will ensure your *Live Education Expert* can assist you in a timely manner.

iReady

All students enrolled at GMS are assigned a learning path in iReady. IReady is technology based program that identifies any opportunities for growth and provides individualized lessons for the student. All students should be completing 45 minutes of active instructional time in both ELA and Math, and passing at least one lesson each week. Please encourage your child to take their time and complete their lessons each week. If you have any questions, contact your students Language Arts or Math teacher.
